#### **ENGLISH NEWS**

On behalf of the English/Drama Faculty, we would like to commend our Year 9 girls who have won the Zone Division of the 2013 Premier's Debating Challenge!

Congratulations to Leticia Lihou, Nischala McDonnell, April Thompson and Ainslea White. With the guidance of Mrs Serrano and Miss Bissett, the girls have worked extremely hard to develop their impressive debating skills and will continue to achieve outstanding results in the future.

We would request that all students return any novels and textbooks that they have in their possession to the English faculty as soon as possible please. This is very important as future students need to be able to study these texts. Thank you to those students who have already done so.

English students in Years 7, 8 and 9 are reminded that The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge ends on 23 August, 2013. This is a compulsory component of the 7, 8 and 9 English courses and does affect your classroom marks. Please advise your English teacher of all of the books you have completed reading by that date to be added to your list. You are to complete 20 books (only 5 books of your own choice – the rest have to be off The Premier's Reading Challenge List – and only two (2) of any series permitted). There is no limit on the amount of books you have on your list, some students have already read over 50 books – good luck and thank you!

Year 7 English students have finished their Unit of Work on Introduction to Poetry and Aboriginal Poetry and submitted their Narrative Assessment Task. They are now working on their Area of Study which is **The Unnatural**. Their next Assessment Task will be an Essay Response which will be due early in Term 4.

Year 8 English students have also completed their Unit of Work on Poetry and Song and Narrative Assessment Task. Year 8 students have also started their Area of Study on Multicultural Australia and the Assessment Task for this will also be an Essay, due early in Term 4.

Year 9 English students have finalised their Unit of Work on Poetry and Refugees and submitted their Narrative Assessment Tasks. Year 9 students have begun their Area of Study on **Aboriginal Experience** with an Essay as their Assessment Task, again due early in Term 4.

Students of Year 10 English have also concluded their study of their Unit of Work on Drama and finalised submission of their Visual Representation Assessment Task. Year 10 students have commenced their Area of Study of <u>War Poetry</u>. They too have an Essay Response as their Assessment Task, due early in Term 4 as well.

Year 11 Advanced English students are continuing their study of Markus Zusak's *The Book Thief.* Year 11 Standard English are also continuing with their study of *Experiencing the World – Poetry* and working on their Assessment Task which is an Essay/Listening Task due in Week 7 of this term. Year 11 English Studies are continuing their work with the Module on <u>Discovery and the World</u>.

Apart from the interval of the Trial HSC Examinations, the Year 12 Advanced English students are progressing well in the study of *The Fiftieth Gate*. Year 12 Standard English student are still working on Module C – <u>The Global Village</u>. The Year 12 English Studies students are enjoying their study of film in *The Big Screen* Module, which will continue once the examinations are over.

In Drama, the Year 9 students have started a Unit on Short Film and will be creating their own short films for their assessment task. Year 10 are working on Monologues and will be presenting their own monologue for their assessment task. The Year 11 students are studying Theatrical Traditions and their assessment task for this unit will be a Group Performance. The Year 12 students continue to work on their Group Devised Performances - HSC Practical Component.

Year 10 and 11 Drama students will be attending an excursion on Wednesday, 28 August, 2013 with Ms Johnson and Ms Kearney. The production, Tom Stoppard's *Rosencrantz & Guildenstern are Dead*, will be presented by the Sydney Theatre Company. Students are to be at Gosford Railway Station no later than 8.30am. For those who are intending to go and have not yet brought in their permission notes and \$20 for the theatre ticket, please give this your urgent attention and pay this to the front office immediately.

Years 9, 10 and 11 Drama students have been offered an excursion to the Sydney Theatre Company to watch *Waiting for Godot* on 19 November. Limited tickets – please return notes and \$20 as soon as possible to secure a place.

In addition to this, Year 11 Drama students will be attending a free performance at the Pilgrim Theatre on 30 August. This devised performance will provide great insight into form and structure for the students' HSC Group Performance. First in, best dressed! Limited seats are available.
