#### **HOW TO GO ABOUT IT**

As in 2015, the Stage 3 students will be constructing their poppies in class at school.

The poppies can be a little tricky in their construction with the younger students bringing there's home for a bit of extra help. Today, the children will have brought home a little package with all that's needed to construct their poppy.

## This includes:

- Red cloth (cut 2 petals to make one poppy)
- 1 green bamboo stake
- Instructions which include the template for cutting out the petals
- Black ribbon
- 1 green rubber band

There is also a youtube instructional video that covers all the elements of building the poppy. Well worth looking at before you start.

It probably sounds a bit straight forward, but we did receive a reminder from the organisers that the poppy flower itself goes on the blunt end of the bamboo stake with the pointy end left for sticking in the ground! We will need all poppies finished and returned to school by Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> April (last week of term) so that I am able to pass them on to the organisers for display.
