NAPLAN Online 2021

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a point in time assessment of literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Our school will be participating in NAPLAN Online between 11 and 21 May 2021.

In preparation for NAPLAN Online, Year 3 and 5 will also be participating in practice tests between 22 March and 1 April. The practice test is a trial-run and key preparation activity for NAPLAN Online in May. It is not an assessment of student ability and the tests will not be marked.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN Online is not recommended. Students can use the <u>public demonstration site (https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site)</u> to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN Online tests.

Teachers have been trained on how to administer assessments.

Check-in Assessment for Years 4 and 6

Dear Parents and Carers

Years 4 and 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy check-in assessment early next term. The checkin assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor Year 4 and 6 student learning following the period of learning from home. The check-in assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

• The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 6 students during Term 2 Week 1

• The assessment will be scheduled for our Year 4 students during Term 2 Week 2

Students with particular learning needs may receive the same level of support during the assessment that they would normally receive in the classroom.

Students will be asked to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment. Earbuds used for mobile phones or other portable devices may be suitable for use during the assessment. The type of computer connection needed is a jack or USB. Alternatively, we will have some school headphones available for use, however personal headphones are preferable.



Shipbuilders Walk – Stage 2

On Thursday 25 March, Year 4 went on an excursion to do the Shipbuilder's Walk. We went to learn about the history of our local area. The walk was located at the waterfront of Davistown.

Peter told us that Aboriginal people were the first to make boats that they could use to get around the area to get materials and food. We went on an excursion to learn about the shipbuilder's history of our local area. We walked down to Davistown Progress Hall and listened to Peter – a local historian and Lyn. They told us that the first ship built was in 1823. The Davis family built lots of boats and that's how Davistown got its name.

My Great, Great, Great Grandpa used to also build ships – his name was George Frost and the Frost Family is an important part of our local area. Frost Reserve is named after my family. Digby 3/4D
