

Do you know that....?

Each year the school budget provided by the Department of Education has to cover the paper and cardboard for photocopying, laminating pouches, toilet paper, soap, sport equipment, all Key Learning Areas- English, Mathematics, Science and Technology, Human Society and Its Environment, Creative Arts and Personal Development Health and Physical Education- resources, Aboriginal Education resources and special days, including Cultural Groups, stationary, staffing costs - teachers, School Learning and Support Officers, General Assistants and School Administrative staff, emergency repairs, Work Health and Safety repairs, library books, teacher and student subscriptions to assist in communication, lessons or with assessment, sand for the sand pit and long jump pit, garbage, furniture, waste collection costs, PSSA sporting team fees, electricity costs, water rates, council rates, professional learning fees and casual costs, Curriculum Reform RFF days for Assistant Principals and teachers, casuals to cover staff leave and additional programs provided for students, technology and STEM resources.

Decreasing numbers mean less in the budget to provide for your children. We are grateful to the P&C for assisting with donations when requested to allow resources to be purchased with extra funds.

On average, every 5 weeks for each stage, the new English Units of work's resources cost between \$600 and \$1000 to ensure our students have the resources needed. We have recently upgraded Maths resources with a \$10 000 order to ensure Stages 2 and 3 have Maths resources needed for the new units of work.

In 2024, voluntary school fees remain the same as in 2023 and learning pack costs have been reduced by half to assist with the cost of living. With the cost of learning packs reduced, this again gives less money to the budget to provide necessary resources.

Please do not pay anticipated costs for 2024, until notes are sent home but please budget for costs in the new school year.

LIBRARY STOCKTAKE

The end of year is quickly approaching and our library stocktake will be starting soon. You can greatly assist the library staff by having a stocktake of your books at home. So often our school library books get mixed up with personal ones. Also, get your children to check in cupboards and under the bed. With the annual stocktake taking place, there will be no borrowing for the next 3 weeks. Please return borrowed books back to the school library as soon as possible.

EMERGENCY PLANNING AND ARRANGEMENTS DURING THE BUSHFIRE SEASON

Brisbania Public School is in a bushfire prone area and is identified as Category 2 on the NSW Department of Education's bushfire risk register.

During the school term, when the NSW Rural Fire Service declares a Catastrophic Fire Danger Rating for the Central Coast, the NSW Department of Education's policy requires the school to temporarily cease operations for the following day. This means the school will be non-operational on these days. The school will inform the school community after 4 pm if there is a change to the operational status of the school for the following day.

In addition, schools may be made non-operational due to changing higher risk conditions and advice from Emergency Services and the State Emergency Operations Centre.

Getting to school by bus in 2024

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a 2024 School Opal cards. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of this year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

School Opal cards

- All students catching the bus in 2024 will need a School Opal card.
- Under the <u>School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS)</u>, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the SSTS and how to apply for a School Opal Card, visit
 https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer, and click 'apply for a school travel pass'.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device.
- 5. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.


